11 FUN FACTS OF PITTSBURGH

- Pittsburgh is known as the "City of Bridges" because it has 446 bridges which is more than Venice, Italy or any other city in the world.
- 2. In 1905, Pittsburgh became home to the first Nickelodeon, or modern movie theater.
- 3. The stars in the Pittsburgh Steelers' logo aren't stars. They are hypocycloids. The logo was "borrowed" from U.S. Steel, which was based in the city.
- 4. Pittsburgh's Beechview neighborhood is home to the steepest street in the United States (and possibly the world): Canton Avenue. It is as steep as 37 degrees.
- 5. While St. Louis is known as the starting point of the Lewis and Clark expedition, the explorers actually first met up in Pittsburgh before heading west on the Ohio River.
- The Big Mac was invented in the Pittsburgh suburbs by Jim Delligatti, a local McDonald's franchisee. It was first sold in 1967.
- In 1903, the first World Series was held between the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Boston Americans. Boston won the series five games to three.
- 8. Pittsburgh is home to the first commercial radio station in the world, KDKA. The station began by broadcasting presidential election results on November 2, 1920.

- Another fact about Pittsburgh that few know is that from 1891 to 1911, Pittsburgh was officially spelled without its "h".
- 10. Forbes Field was the country's first concrete and steel baseball stadium when it opened on June 30, 1909.
- 11. The country's first gas station was opened in 1913 at Baum Boulevard and St. Clair Street in East Liberty.

From the Desk of the Secretary / Treasurer

Leagues, MBBA & SBBA Secretaries, Active Life members, Officers, and Tournament Directors

We regret we have been unable to supply rails to some, yet we are still asking any league or members with used rails they are willing to donate or sell to please contact the Secretary as soon as possible.

A few reminders (especially for new secretaries)

- Minutes should be maintained for all league meetings.
- A prize list should be approved by the league at least by the 5th week of the bowling season. It can be amended at a later date.
- The fiscal year for ABBA is August 1st through July 31st of the following year.

Leagues should review and update their by-laws or constitution on an annual basis per ABBA bylaws Article IV, Sec. 3.

Policy Statement F-3, Financial Reports From Member Leagues, approved in November 2011: Leagues under ABBA's 501c3 status <u>must submit</u> a brief Fund Raising Guideline explaining how the proceeds will be used.

This information should be recorded in the meeting minutes. The league's fund-raising guideline should be sent to the ABBA Secretary-Treasurer if the league plans to raise more than <u>\$1,000</u> in a year. That amount does not include prize money.

League secretaries must file the 990 EZ form with the IRS each year. If this is not done, the league is removed from the list of ABBA leagues covered by the nonprofit status. Leagues not covered under the 501c3 status do not have to follow this procedure.

Convention/Tournament, May 29 – June 3, 2019 – Hotel, Sheraton Pittsburgh, At Station Square. Reservations can be made now by calling :800-325-3535

Must identify yourself as a member of ABBA to receive Group rate – May \$105 subjected to a 14% tax, double/double or double king, rate will be honored (3) days before group arrival and (3) days after group departs.

Each guest should contact the hotel at least (30) days prior to your arrival and identify yourself as part of ABBA, provide your name, request type of room and request bed type, (king, double/double/queen, twin or suite).

Check in is at 3 pm and check out 12 noon. Anyone wishing special consideration for late checkout should inquire at the front desk on the day of departure. If a reservation must be cancelled, please notify the hotel by 3 pm the day prior to arrival in order to avoid being billed for the first night's stay.

When reservations are made, the hotel will require a deposit equal to the room rate and tax for the first night for each reservation. A deposit is refundable to you if the Hotel receives notice of your cancellation at least 48 hours prior to scheduled arrival. Upon check-in each guest will be required to present a valid credit card upon check-in on which an amount of sufficient pre-authorization can be obtained to cover the room and tax charges for the length of the guest's stay, plus the anticipated use of the hotel's ancillary services.

Convention Schedule will be available in the next issue of the Blind Bowler.

Tournament Director, Sandy McDaniel, will list all information regarding bowling times and lanes.

Reminders

Once again, hopefully, no one will contact the hotel regarding our schedule before notifying the Secretary or President and in some cases bringing it before the Board.

We have lost some leagues due to deaths or various things happening in the life of members, but on a more positive note, we have some new leagues forming. People across the country have/have asked to purchase rails, especially the VA facilities. Some wanted the procedure for ordering, we are going to try and make sure this is on our website.

- 1. State number of rails needed, include location, receiver addresses & phone#
- 2. Will reply with total cost inclusive of shipping.
- 3. Send a check or money order made out to ABBA 2829 Tall Oaks Ct. Apt.11, Auburn Hills, MI 48326 (we do not take credit cards)
- 4. Upon receipt of money, the rail manager will be contacted to ship rail/s, turnover time, approximately 7 days. Prices of rails are subject to change this season.

DeVelle Baldwin attended The Statler Center for Hospitality from September 5, 2018 to November 7, 2018 for the Business Fundamentals and Telecommunications courses. You can now start making your room reservations for the 72nd ABBA National Tournament and Convention in Pittsburgh.

The Hotel is the Sheraton in Station Square. The address is 300 West Station Square Drive. Pittsburgh, PA. 15219. Phone number is (412) 261- 2000.

Room rate is \$105 per night plus 13% tax. This room rate is good for 3 days before and 3 days after the tournament. Tournament dates again are Wednesday May 29th through Monday June 3rd. Cut-off date for all reservations is April 29th 2019. Please remember to let the hotel know that you are with the blind bowlers when you make your reservation to get the \$105 room rate. Bowling squad times are Thursday night May 30th through Sunday June 2nd. The Convention will be held Sunday, night June 2nd at 8 pm. The Tournament is the weekend after Memorial Day. Pittsburgh is a big city. There is lots to see and lots to do. So you may want to come in a couple days earlier to have enough time to **enjoy** the whole Pittsburgh Experience. Why not just make it a **vacation** and take advantage of the extra room rate days. There will be a **10% discount** each way from Super Shuttle for those of you who plan on flying. If you plan to travel by Greyhound or Amtrak the hotel courtesy van will pick you up by calling 412-292-1829.

Station Square is a 52 acre riverfront complex with over 1.2 miles of Pittsburgh's most unique dining and entertainment just steps outside of the Sheraton Hotel. Which has plenty of restaurants and entertainment for you to choose from.
